SCHU S4 antigen was prepared by formalin inactivation of a suspension of *Francisella tularensis* subsp. *tularensis* (Type A), strain SCHU S4.¹⁻³

Each vial contains approximately 1 mL of NR-15753 formulated in 0.05 M PBS, pH 7.2. The concentration is shown on the Certificate of Analysis for each lot.

Packaging/Storage:

NR-15753 is provided frozen on dry ice and should be stored at -70°C ± 10°C immediately upon arrival.
