**Product Description:** *Mycobacterium tuberculosis* (*M. tuberculosis*), transposon mutant 1536 was created by disruption of a possible glycosyl transferase (MT3034, Rv2958c), of the wild-type strain CDC1551. *M. tuberculosis*, strain CDC1551 is a clinical isolate that exhibited high levels of infectivity and virulence during a tuberculosis outbreak that occurred in rural Kentucky and Tennessee from 1994 to 1996.
