# **Product Description:**

- <u>Original Source</u>: *Staphylococcus epidermidis* (*S. epidermidis*), strain NIHLM003 was isolated in 2008 from the umbilicus of a healthy 27-year-old white male volunteer in the United States.<sup>1,2</sup>
- <u>Comments</u>: *S. epidermidis*, strain NIHLM003 is reported to be sensitive to methicillin.<sup>1,2</sup> *S. epidermidis*, strain NIHLM003 (<u>HMP ID 9976</u>) is a reference genome for <u>The</u> <u>Human Microbiome Project</u> (HMP). HMP is an initiative to identify and characterize human microbial flora. The complete genome of *S. epidermidis*, strain NIHLM003 was sequenced at the <u>NIH Intramural Sequencing Center</u> (GenBank: AKHB00000000).<sup>2</sup>
- <u>Note</u>: HMP material is taxonomically classified by the depositor. Quality control of these materials is only performed to demonstrate that the material distributed by BEI Resources is identical to the deposited material.

*S. epidermidis* is a very hearty, Gram-positive, cluster-forming coccus that normally colonizes human skin and nostrils. It is the most common source of infection on indwelling medical devices, particularly catheters, and is now seen as an important opportunistic pathogen.<sup>3</sup>

# Material Provided:

Each vial contains approximately 0.5 mL of bacterial culture in 0.5X Nutrient broth supplemented with 10% glycerol.

<u>Note</u>: If homogeneity is required for your intended use, please purify prior to initiating work.

## Packaging/Storage:

HM-897 was packaged aseptically, in screw-capped plastic cryovials. The product is provided frozen and should be stored at -60°C or colder immediately upon arrival. For long-term storage, the vapor phase of a liquid nitrogen freezer is recommended. Freeze-thaw cycles should be avoided.

#### Media:

Brain Heart Infusion broth or equivalent Tryptic Soy agar with 5% sheep blood or equivalent Incubation: Temperature: 37°C Atmosphere: Aerobic <u>Propagation</u>: 1. Keep vial frozen until ready for use, then thaw.

- Transfer the entire thawed aliquot into a single tube of broth.
- 3. Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate an agar slant and/or plate.
- 4. Incubate the tube, slant and/or plate at 37°C for 24 hours.
