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# **Product Description:**

Genomic DNA was isolated from a preparation of *Campylobacter jejuni* subsp. *jejuni*, strain LRA 094.06.89.

Campylobacter jejuni (C. jejuni) is a Gram-negative, slender, curved, motile rod commonly found in animal feces. It is a thermophilic and microaerophilic organism that is sensitive to environmental stresses. 

C. jejuni is among the most frequently identified bacterial causes of human gastroenteritis in the U.S. and other industrialized countries. Recently, cytolethal distending toxin was identified in many strains of C. jejuni (including LRA 094.06.89) and is an important virulence determinant.

NR-4208 has been qualified for PCR applications by amplification of approximately 1500 bp of the 16S ribosomal RNA gene.

## **Material Provided:**

Each vial contains 4 to 6  $\mu g$  of bacterial genomic DNA in TE buffer (10 mM Tris-HCl, 1 mM EDTA, pH ~7.4). The concentration is shown on the Certificate of Analysis. The vial should be centrifuged prior to opening.

# Packaging/Storage:

NR-4208 was packaged aseptically in screw-capped plastic cryovials. The product is provided frozen on dry ice and should be stored at -20°C or colder immediately upon arrival. Freeze-thaw cycles should be minimized.
