Original Source: Staphylococcus aureus (S. aureus), strain Sa1554 was isolated in 2005 from the bloodstream of a patient with septicemia in Helsinki, Finland.^{1,2}

Comments: S. aureus, strain Sa1554 can be auto-induced following ultraviolet radiation treatment to produce bacteriophage phi05_1554UV/Sa1554.¹ Bacteriophage phi05_1554UV/Sa1554.¹ Bacteriophage phi05_1554UV/Sa1554 belongs to unclassified Siphoviridae family of viruses and is a highly selective virus that is extremely effective at lysing S. aureus.¹ Bacteriophage phi05_1554UV/Sa1554 (HMP ID 9791) is a reference genome for The Human Microbiome Project (HMP). The complete genome of bacteriophage phi05_1554UV/Sa1554 is currently being sequenced at the J. Craig Venter Institute.

S. aureus is a Gram-positive, cluster-forming coccus that normally inhabits human nasal passages, skin and mucus membranes. It is also a human pathogen and causes a variety of pus-forming infections as well as food-poisoning and toxic shock syndrome. In 1961, two years after the introduction of methicillin, a penicillinase-resistant penicillin, S. aureus developed methicillin-resistance due to acquisition of the mecA gene. Subsequently, MRSA infections have become widespread in both hospital and community settings.³

Material Provided:

Each vial contains approximately 0.5 mL of bacterial culture in Brain Heart Infusion broth supplemented with 10% glycerol.

Note: If homogeneity is required for your intended use, please purify prior to initiating work.

Packaging/Storage:

NR-51344 was packaged aseptically in cryovials. The product is provided frozen and should be stored at -60°C or colder immediately upon arrival. For long-term storage, the vapor phase of a liquid nitrogen freezer is recommended. Freezethaw cycles should be avoided.

Tryptic Soy broth or Brain Heart Infusion broth or equivalent

Tryptic Soy agar with 5% defibrinated sheep blood or Brain Heart Infusion agar or equivalent

Incubation:

Temperature: 37°C Atmosphere: Aerobic

Propagation:

- 1. Keep vial frozen until ready for use, then thaw.
- Transfer the entire thawed aliquot into a single tube of broth.
- Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate an agar slant and/or plate.
- 4. Incubate the tube, slant and/or plate at 37°C for 1 day.
