<u>Bacteria Classification</u>: *Enterobacteriaceae, Klebsiella* <u>Species</u>: *Klebsiella pneumoniae subsp. pneumoniae* Strain: WGLW2

<u>Original Source</u>: Klebsiella pneumoniae (K. pneumoniae) subsp. pneumoniae, strain WGLW2 was isolated from human sputum in Massachusetts, USA.¹

<u>Comments</u>: *K. pneumoniae* subsp. *pneumoniae*, strain WGLW2 (<u>HMP ID 1306</u>) is a reference genome for <u>The Human Microbiome Project</u> (HMP). HMP is an initiative to identify and characterize human microbial flora. The complete genome of *K. pneumoniae* subsp. *pneumoniae*, strain WGLW2 was sequenced at the <u>Broad Institute</u> (GenBank: AMLM00000000).

Note: HMP material is taxonomically classified by the depositor. Quality control of these materials is only performed to demonstrate that the material distributed by BEI Resources is identical to the deposited material.

 $\it K.$ pneumoniae subsp. pneumoniae is a Gram-negative enterobacterium that is a major cause of nosocomial infections of the urinary and respiratory tracts.² The primary isolates emerging from these settings contain the plasmid-bound $\it bla_{\rm KPC}$ gene conferring specific resistance to the carbapenem class of antibiotics, as well as other $\it β$ -lactams.²⁻⁴ Virulence is derived from the complex acidic polysaccharide capsules, which provide protection from phagocytosis, and also give the colonies their characteristic mucoid appearance.²

Material Provided:

Each vial contains approximately 0.5 mL of bacterial culture in Nutrient broth supplemented with 10% glycerol.

<u>Note</u>: If homogeneity is required for your intended use, please purify prior to initiating work.

Packaging/Storage:

HM-751 was packaged aseptically, in screw-capped plastic cryovials. The product is provided frozen and should be stored at -60°C or colder immediately upon arrival. For long-term

storage, the vapor phase of a liquid nitrogen freezer is recommended. Freeze-thaw cycles should be avoided.

Incubation:

Temperature: 37°C Atmosphere: Aerobic

Propagation:

- 1. Keep vial frozen until ready for use, then thaw.
- Transfer the entire thawed aliquot into a single tube of broth.
- Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate an agar slant and/or plate.
- 4. Incubate the tube, slant and/or plate at 37°C for 1 day.
