- Strain: 6_1_63FAA Original Source: Lachnospiraceae bacterium, strain 6 1 63FAA was obtained from a healthy biopsy sample taken from the ascending colon of a 51-year-old female patient with remittent Crohn's disease.1
- Comments: Lachnospiraceae bacterium, strain 6_1_63FAA (HMP ID 0992) is a reference genome for The Human Microbiome Project (HMP).² HMP is an initiative to identify and characterize human microbial flora. The complete genome of Lachnospiraceae bacterium, strain 6 1 63FAA was sequenced the Broad Institute at (GenBank: ACTV0000000).
- Note: HMP material is taxonomically classified by the Quality control of these materials is only depositor. performed to demonstrate that the material distributed by BEI Resources is identical to the deposited material.

Lachnospiraceae bacterium, strain 6 1 63FAA is a strictly anaerobic, non-spore-forming, non-motile, rod-shaped bacterium. Lachnospiraceae species have a Gram-positive cell wall but some strains have been reported to stain Gramvariable or Gram-negative depending on the duration of growth.3

Material Provided:

Each vial contains approximately 0.5 mL of bacterial culture in Modified Trypticase-Yeast Extract (TY) broth supplemented with 10% glycerol.

Note: If homogeneity is required for your intended use, please purify prior to initiating work.

Packaging/Storage:

HM-150 was packaged aseptically in cryovials. The product is provided frozen and should be stored at -60°C or colder immediately upon arrival. For long-term storage, the vapor phase of a liquid nitrogen freezer is recommended. Freeze-thaw cycles should be avoided.

Growth Conditions:

Media:

Trypticase-Yeast Extract (TY) broth or equivalent Tryptic Soy Agar with 5% sheep blood or equivalent Incubation: Temperature: 37°C Atmosphere: Anaerobic Propagation: Keep vial frozen until ready for use, then thaw. 1.

- 2. Transfer the entire thawed aliquot into a single tube of broth.
- 3. Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate an agar slant and/or plate.
- 4 Incubate the tube, slant and/or plate at 37°C for 2 to 3 days.
