

## Genomic RNA from Enterovirus Species D Type 68, US/KY/14-18953

### Product Description:

Genomic RNA was isolated from a preparation of cell lysate and supernatant from human rhabdomyosarcoma cells (RD; ATCC® CCL-136™) infected with enterovirus species D type 68 (EVD-68), US/KY/14-18953. EVD-68, US/KY/14-18953 was isolated from a nasopharyngeal swab taken from a human in Kentucky, USA, in August, 2014.<sup>1</sup> The complete genome of EVD-68, US/KY/14-18953 has been sequenced (GenBank: [KM851231](#)).

NR-49137 has been qualified for PCR applications by amplification of an approximately 1100 base pairs of the VP1 capsid gene. Recommended dilutions for successful RT-PCR amplification are indicated on the Certificate of Analysis for each lot.

### Material Provided:

Each vial contains approximately 100 µL of viral genomic RNA in TE buffer (10 mM Tris-HCl, 1 mM EDTA, pH 7.0). The viral genomic RNA is in a background of cellular nucleic acid and carrier RNA. The vial should be centrifuged prior to opening.

### Packaging/Storage:

NR-49137 was packaged aseptically in screw-capped plastic cryovials. The product is provided frozen on dry ice and should be stored at -60°C or colder immediately upon arrival. Freeze-thaw cycles should be minimized.
