*Pseudomonas aeruginosa* (*P. aeruginosa*), strain 1145009 was isolated in 2014 from a blood sample of a 55-year-old male in Turkey. It was deposited as resistant to aztreonam, cefepime, ceftazidime, ciprofloxacin, doripenem, imipenem, levofloxacin, meropenem and piperacillin-tazobactam. NR-56664 was produced by inoculation of the deposited material into Tryptic Soy broth and grown for 1 day at 37°C in an aerobic atmosphere. The material from the initial growth was passaged in Tryptic Soy broth for 1 day at 37°C in an aerobic atmosphere to produce this lot. Quality control testing was completed under propagation conditions unless otherwise noted.
