Product Description:

Diarrheagenic Escherichia coli (E. coli) are classified into several pathogenic groups based on their virulence characteristics. NR-12201 contains forward and reverse primers that specifically amplify a region of the virulence target heat labile enterotoxin, elt, found on plasmid pJY11 of enterotoxigenic E. coli (ETEC).

Material Provided:

Each vial contains approximately 80 µL of a mixture of forward and reverse primers in TE buffer (pH 7.0). The concentration is shown on the Certificate of Analysis.

Note: *E. coli* 12-Target Multiplex PCR 10X Buffer (BEI Resources NR-13440) will be provided with your shipment of NR-12201.

Packaging/Storage:

Primers were packaged aseptically in screw-capped plastic cryovials. The product is provided frozen on dry ice and should be stored at -60°C or colder upon arrival. Freeze-thaw cycles should be minimized.

1	1	1	94°C for 5 minutes
2	30	1	94°C for 1 minute
		2	52°C for 1 minute
		3	72°C for 1 minute
3	1	1	72°C for 7 minutes
4	Indefinite	1	Hold at 4°C
