Antibody Designation: α -ACG

Polyclonal antiserum to an acrosin-coregulated gene protein (ACG, also referred to as 37 kDa conserved hypothetical protein, Gene Rv2032) of *Mycobacterium tuberculosis*, strain H37Rv was produced in rabbits. The antiserum is reported to be active in ELISA and Western Blot assays.

Material Provided:

Each vial contains approximately 250 μ L of NR-36514 provided as serum.

Packaging/Storage:

NR-36514 was packaged aseptically in screw-cap cryovials. The product is provided frozen on dry ice and should be stored at -80°C or colder immediately upon arrival. Freeze-thaw cycles should be avoided.
