Antibody Designation (Original Designation): IT-56 (CBA1)
Monoclonal antibody to *Mycobacterium tuberculosis*, strain H37Rv GroEL2 protein (also known as 65 kDa antigen) was produced in cell culture using a B cell hybridoma generated by the fusion of myeloma cells with immunized mouse splenocytes.

Material Provided:

Each vial contains approximately 500 µL of NR-13655 provided as cell culture supernatant.

Packaging/Storage:

NR-13655 was packaged aseptically in screw-cap cryovials. The product is provided frozen on dry ice and should be stored at -80°C or colder immediately upon arrival. Freeze-thaw cycles should be avoided.
