

N9 Neuraminidase (NA) Protein from Influenza Virus, A/Anhui/1/2013 (H7N9), Recombinant from Baculovirus

Product Description:

A recombinant form of the N9 neuraminidase (NA) protein from influenza A virus, A/Anhui/1/2013 (H7N9)¹ was produced in Sf9 insect cells using a baculovirus expression vector system. The predicted ectodomain coding region of the NA gene was fused to a synthetic gene segment encoding an N-terminal six histidine tag followed by a tetramerization domain from vasodilator-stimulated phosphoprotein (VASP) and a thrombin cleavage site.^{2,3} The protein was purified by nickel affinity chromatography and then treated with thrombin to remove the tetramerization domain and the histidine tag. The thrombin-treated protein was further purified prior to final formulation. The full-length NA precursor protein is 465 residues (GISAID EpiFlu: EPI439509).

Material Provided:

Each vial contains 25 µg to 75 µg of purified recombinant NA protein in PBS (pH 7.4). The protein content in µg and the concentration, expressed as µg per mL, are shown on the Certificate of Analysis.

Packaging/Storage:

Purified recombinant NA protein was packaged aseptically in screw-capped plastic cryovials. This product is provided on blue ice and should be stored at -20°C immediately upon arrival.

Functional Activity:

NR-44082 was demonstrated to be functionally active based on its ability to cleave the fluorogenic substrate 2'-(4-methylumbelliferyl)-α-D-N-acetylneuraminic acid (4-MUNANA).⁴
