Product Description:

NR-14869 is a recombinant form of the culture filtrate antigen CFP-10 from *Mycobacterium tuberculosis*.¹ The recombinant protein consists of the native protein sequence in addition to a hexa-histidine tag. The recombinant protein was expressed in *Escherichia coli* and purified using standard chromatographic techniques followed by endotoxin removal procedures.

<u>Note</u>: This protein is provided as a reference standard and should be ordered with the corresponding plasmid (pMRLB.46; NR-13297).

Material Provided:

Each vial contains approximately 1 mg of lyophilized NR-14869 in 10 mM ammonium bicarbonate.

<u>Note</u>: NR-14869 is soluble in 100 mM to 500 mM aqueous buffered salt solutions, such as phosphate buffered saline. A 10 mM ammonium bicarbonate solution can also be used.

Packaging/Storage:

NR-14869 was packaged aseptically in cryovials. The product is provided frozen on dry ice and should be stored at -80°C or colder immediately upon arrival. Freeze-thaw cycles should be avoided.
