Antibody Class: IgG1k

Mouse monoclonal antibody prepared against the Rift Valley fever virus (RVFV) Gc glycoprotein was purified from clone 5E2 hybridoma supernatant by protein G affinity chromatography. The B cell hybridoma was generated by the fusion of Sp2/0-Ag14 mouse myeloma cells with splenocytes from immunized BALB/c mice.¹

This reagent is part of the Joel M. Dalrymple – Clarence J. Peters USAMRIID Antibody Collection.

Material Provided:

Each vial of NR-43192 contains approximately 100 µL of purified monoclonal antibody in PBS. The concentration, expressed as mg per mL, is shown on the Certificate of Analysis.

Packaging/Storage:

NR-43192 was packaged aseptically in screw-capped plastic vials and is provided frozen on dry ice. The product should be stored at -20°C or colder immediately upon arrival. Freeze-thaw cycles should be avoided.

Functional Activity:

NR-43192 is reactive in indirect immunofluorescence assays using Vero E6 cells infected with RVFV, and has weak neutralizing activity against RVFV in plaque reduction neutralization tests. See Certificate of Analysis for details. The antibody is also reported to function in ELISA.¹
