Product Description:

Genomic DNA was extracted from a preparation of *Brucella* abortus (B. abortus), strain RB51 (also referred to as strain RB51-AHVLA).

B. abortus, strain RB51 is an attenuated, stable rough mutant derived from the virulent strain 2308.^{1,2} *B. abortus*, strain RB51 is the official vaccine for the U.S. bovine eradication program, and is also being used in several other countries to prevent and control animal brucellosis.¹ The complete genomic sequence of *B. abortus*, strain RB51-AHVLA is available (GenBank: AQIE00000000).

NR-50169 has been qualified for PCR applications by amplification of approximately 1500 base pairs of the 16S ribosomal RNA gene.

Material Provided:

Each vial contains approximately $0.7~\mu g$ to $1.5~\mu g$ bacterial genomic DNA in 10 mM Tris-HCl buffer, pH 8.0-8.5. The vial should be centrifuged prior to opening.

Packaging/Storage:

NR-50169 was packaged aseptically in screw-capped plastic cryovials. The product is provided frozen and should be stored at -20°C or colder immediately upon arrival. For long-term storage, the product should be stored at -80°C. Freeze-thaw cycles should be minimized. Note: NR-50169 is not provided in EDTA; for long-term storage, EDTA may be added to a final concentration of 0.1 mM to 1 mM.
