#### **Product Description:**

Genomic RNA was isolated from a preparation of cell lysate and supernatant from *Cercopithecus aethiops* kidney epithelial cells (Vero 76, clone E6; ATCC<sup>®</sup> CRL-1586™) infected with Zika virus (ZIKV), P 6-740. The complete genomic sequence of ZIKV, P 6-740 has been determined (GenBank: KX377336).¹

NR-50439 has been qualified for PCR applications by amplification of an approximately 1100 nucleotide sequence. Recommended dilutions for successful RT-PCR amplification are indicated on the Certificate of Analysis for each lot.

#### **Material Provided:**

Each vial contains 100  $\mu$ L of viral genomic RNA in TE buffer (10 mM Tris-HCl, 1 mM EDTA, pH 7.0). The viral genomic RNA is in a background of cellular nucleic acid and carrier RNA. The vial should be centrifuged prior to opening.

#### Packaging/Storage:

NR-50439 was packaged aseptically in screw-capped plastic cryovials. The product is provided frozen on dry ice and should be stored at -60°C or colder immediately upon arrival. Freeze-thaw cycles should be minimized.
