Mouse monoclonal antibody prepared against the surface antigen P35 protein of *Toxoplasma gondii* (*T. gondii*) clone T4 3F12 was purified from the hybridoma supernatant by protein G affinity chromatography. The B cell hybridoma was generated by the fusion of SP2/0 myeloma cells with immunized BALB/c mouse splenocytes. Clone T4 3F12 recognizes the P35 protein.^{1,2} The P35 protein (~ 35 kDa) is one of five major surface proteins of *T. gondii* tachyzoites, all of which are anchored to the plasma membrane via glycosylphosphatidyl-inositols.³

Material Provided:

Each vial contains approximately 100 µL of purified monoclonal antibody in PBS (pH 7.4). The concentration, expressed as mg per mL, is shown on the Certificate of Analysis.

Packaging/Storage:

NR-50259 was packaged aseptically in screw-capped plastic vials and is provided frozen on dry ice. The product should be stored at -20°C or colder immediately upon arrival. Freeze-thaw cycles should be avoided.

Functional Activity:

NR-50259 is reported to react with native P35 and to function in immunofluorescence and immunoblot assays.^{1,2}
