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### **Product Description:**

NR-50816 is plasma collected on June 7, 2016, from a human subject with a confirmed acute Zika virus (ZIKV) infection and prior dengue virus (DENV) exposure. The sample is positive for ZIKV RNA, negative for anti-ZIKV IgM, and positive for anti-DENV IgG.<sup>1</sup>

#### **Material Provided:**

Each vial contains approximately 0.5 mL of plasma.

# Packaging/Storage:

NR-50816 was packaged aseptically in screw-capped plastic cryovials. The product is provided frozen on dry ice and should be stored at -80°C or colder immediately upon arrival. Freeze-thaw cycles should be avoided.
