Genomic DNA was extracted from a preparation of *Plasmodium falciparum (P. falciparum)*, strain 7C7. Strain 7C7 is a genetic cross progeny of *P. falciparum* strains HB3 and Dd2.^{1,2}

MRA-169G has been qualified for PCR applications by amplification of 600 to 900 base pairs of the merozoite surface protein 2 (MSP2) gene.

Material Provided:

Each vial of MRA-169G contains approximately 0.5 μ g of genomic DNA at a concentration of 10 μ g per mL in TE buffer (10 mM Tris-HCl and 0.5 mM EDTA, pH 9). The vial should be centrifuged prior to opening.

Packaging/Storage:

MRA-169G was packaged aseptically in screw-capped plastic cryovials. The product is provided frozen and should be stored at -20°C or colder immediately upon arrival. Freeze-thaw cycles should be minimized.
