Product Description:

Genomic DNA was extracted from a preparation of *Candida albicans* (*C. albicans*), strain P57072.

C. albicans, strain P57072 is a bloodstream isolate from a person with a bloodstream infection collected in Iowa, USA in 2000.¹ Strain P57072 is a member of genetic clade II and has an alpha/alpha *MTL* genotype.^{1,2} The complete genome of *C. albicans*, strain P57072 has been sequenced (GenBank: [AJIY000000000](https://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/nuccore/AJIY000000000)).

NR-50309 has been qualified for PCR applications by amplification of approximately 1200 base pairs of ribosomal RNA and internal transcribed spacer (ITS) region.

Material Provided:

Each vial contains fungal genomic DNA in buffer. The amount per vial, concentration and buffer composition are shown on the Certificate of Analysis. The vial should be centrifuged prior to opening.

Packaging/Storage:

NR-50309 was packaged aseptically in screw-capped plastic cryovials. The product is provided frozen and should be stored at -20°C or colder immediately upon arrival. For long-term storage, the product should be stored at -80°C. Freeze-thaw cycles should be minimized.
