Genomic DNA was extracted from a preparation of *Encephalitozoon intestinalis (E. intestinalis)*, alveolar isolate, which was isolated in 1994 from an AIDS patient in New York, USA.<sup>1</sup>

The complete genome of *E. intestinalis*, alveolar isolate is available (GenBank: CP001942 to CP001952).

NR-34575 has been qualified for PCR applications by amplification of approximately 1200 base pairs of 18S ribosomal RNA.

#### **Material Provided:**

Each vial contains fungal genomic DNA in buffer. Please refer to the Certificate of Analysis for the specific buffer used for each lot. The vial should be centrifuged prior to opening.

#### Packaging/Storage:

NR-34575 was packaged aseptically in screw-capped plastic cryovials. The product is provided frozen and should be stored at -20°C or colder immediately upon arrival. Freeze-thaw cycles should be minimized.
