Product Description:

Genomic DNA was isolated from a preparation of cell lysate and supernatant from African green monkey cells (ATCC® CRL-2378.1™) infected with vaccinia virus, Western Reserve (WR; mouse adapted; BEI Resources NR-56).

The WR (mouse adapted) strain was derived from the original New York City Board of Health (NYCBH) strain by intracerebral passages in mice.^{1,2} It has been utilized in constructing vectors for gene expression³ and in producing viral proteins and DNA.⁴ The complete genomic sequence of vaccinia virus, WR has been determined (GenBank: AY243312).⁵

NR-2640 has been qualified for PCR applications by amplification of a sequence of at least 1000 bp. See Certification of Analysis for details. NR-2640 is not intended for use as a standard for quantitative PCR.

Material Provided:

Each vial contains 100 µL of viral genomic DNA in TE buffer (10 mM Tris-HCl, 1 mM EDTA, pH 7.0). The viral genomic DNA is in a background of cellular nucleic acid and carrier RNA. The vial should be centrifuged prior to opening.

Packaging/Storage:

NR-2640 was packaged aseptically in screw-capped plastic cryovials. The product is provided frozen on dry ice and should be stored at -20°C or colder immediately upon arrival. Freeze-thaw cycles should be minimized.
