Description: A 2191 mAb heavy chain expression vector which can be used with the corresponding 2191 mAb light chain expression vector (cat# 13640) to produce the monoclonal antibody, 2191 (cat# 11682).

Special Characteristics: This construct is approximately 6000 bp including the insert.
This is a heavy chain expression vector for the broadly neutralizing antibody, 2191.
This plasmid can be used in conjunction with the complementary 2191 mAb light chain expression vector (cat# 13640) to produce the monoclonal antibody, 2191 (cat# 11682).

Plasmids can be propagated in STBL2 cells and grown at 37°C. Larger plasmids may benefit from growth at 30°C. This construct may also be grown in other competent cells.
