**Solubility:** DMSO; also soluble in water to about 20 mg/ml.

**Mechanical Action:** Zidovudine is a nucleoside analogue of the naturally occurring nucleoside, thymidine. Zidovudine is converted to zidovudine 5'-triphosphate by cellular enzymes. Zidovudine 5'-triphosphate inhibits the activity of the HIV-1 reverse transcriptase by competing with utilization of natural substrate, deoxythymidine 5'-triphosphate and by its incorporation into viral DNA. The lack of 3'-OH group in the incorporated nucleoside analogue prevents the formation of the 5' to 3' phosphodiester linkage essential for DNA chain elongation. Zidovudine 5'-triphosphate is also a weak inhibitor of cellular DNA polymerase and mitochondrial polymerase.
