<b>Solubility:</b>	Soluble in methanol, ethanol, chloroform, DMSO, acetonitrile, and methylene chloride. Insoluble in water and hexane.
<b>Mechanical Action:</b>	Amprenavir is an inhibitor of HIV-1 protease. Amprenavir binds to the active site of HIV-1 protease and thereby prevents the processing of viral <i>gag</i> and <i>gag-pol</i> polyprotein precursors, resulting in the formation of immature non-infectious viral particles.
<b>Recommended Storage:</b>	Room temperature. Once resuspended, working aliquots can be stored at -20°C.
