<u>Virus Classification</u>: *Paramyxoviridae, Morbillivirus* <u>Species</u>: Measles virus

Strain/Isolate: Edmonston

- <u>Original Source</u>: Measles virus (MeV), Edmonston was isolated from the blood of a human in the acute phase of typical measles in Massachusetts, USA, in 1954.¹
- <u>Comments</u>: NR-44362 was derived from BEI Resources NR-3847, a virus preparation from NIAID's historical repository. NR-3847 was passaged four times in MRC-5 cells (ATCC[®] CCL-171[™]) to produce NR-44362. The complete genome of the Edmonston strain has been sequenced (GenBank: <u>K01711</u>).

Material Provided:

Each vial contains approximately 1 mL of cell lysate and supernatant from human lung fibroblast cells (MRC-5, ATCC[®] CCL-171[™]) infected with MeV, Edmonston.

<u>Note</u>: If homogeneity is required for your intended use, please purify prior to initiating work.

Packaging/Storage:

NR-44362 was packaged aseptically in screw-capped plastic cryovials. The product is provided frozen and should be stored at -60°C or colder immediately upon arrival. For long-term storage, the vapor phase of a liquid nitrogen freezer is recommended. Freeze-thaw cycles should be avoided.

Growth Conditions:

<u>Host</u>: Human lung fibroblast cells (MRC-5; ATCC[®] CCL-171™)

<u>Growth Medium</u>: Eagle's Minimum Essential Medium with Earle's Balanced Salt Solution, non-essential amino acids, 2 mM L-glutamine, 1 mM sodium pyruvate, and 1500 mg/L sodium bicarbonate, supplemented with 2% fetal bovine serum.

<u>Infection</u>: Cells should be 80% to 100% confluent <u>Incubation</u>: 8 to 14 days at 37°C and 5% CO₂ <u>Cytopathic Effect</u>: Shrinking and detachment
