## **Product Description:**

<u>Original Source</u>: *Klebsiella pneumoniae (K. pneumoniae*), strain MRSN 414780 was isolated in 2016 from a human urine sample in North America as part of a global surveillance program.<sup>1</sup>

Comments: K. pneumoniae, strain MRSN 414780 was deposited as part of the MRSN Klebsiella pneumoniae Diversity Panel available from BEI Resources as NR-55604. NR-55554 was deposited as multi-locus sequence type (MLST) ST 323, K-locus type (KL) 21, O-locus type (OL) O3b and VIR score 0. MRSN 414780 was deposited as an extensively drug-resistant strain (XDR), sensitive to amikacin, ceftazidime/avibactam, ceftolozane/tazobactam, ertapenem, imipenem and meropenem, intermediately resistant to piperacillin/tazobactam, tigecycline and tobramycin and resistant to ampicillin/sulbactam, aztreonam. cefepime. ceftazidime. ciprofloxacin, gentamicin, levofloxacin, tetracycline and trimethoprim/sulfamethoxazole. Strain MRSN 414780 is reported to have four aminoglycoside transferase genes [aac(3)-IIe, aac(6')-Ib-cr5, aph(3'')-Ib and aph(6)-Id; conferring resistance to various aminoglycosides], four beta-lactamase genes (blactx-M-15, blacxA-1, blashv-1 and bla<sub>TEM-1</sub>; conferring resistance to beta-lactams), one chloramphenicol acetyltransferase gene (catB3; conferring resistance to chloramphenicol), two fosfomycin resistance genes (fosA gen and fosA7.3; conferring resistance to fosfomycin), one quinolone resistance gene (qnrB1; conferring resistance to quinolones), one sulfonamide resistance (sul2; conferring resistance gene sulfonamides), one tetracycline resistance gene [tet(A); conferring resistance to tetracycline] and one dihydrofolate reductase gene (dfrA14; conferring resistance to trimethoprim). The complete genome of *K. pneumoniae*, strain MRSN 414780 has been sequenced (GenBank: JAGYDF000000000).

K. pneumoniae is a Gram-negative enterobacterium that is a major cause of nosocomial infections of the urinary and respiratory tracts. Due to the extensive spread of

antibiotic-resistant strains, especially of extended-spectrum  $\beta$ -lactamase (ESBL)-producing strains, there has been renewed interest in *Klebsiella* infections.<sup>2,3,4</sup>

#### **Material Provided:**

Each vial contains approximately 0.5 mL of bacterial culture in Tryptic Soy broth supplemented with 10% glycerol.

<u>Note</u>: If homogeneity is required for your intended use, please purify prior to initiating work.

## Packaging/Storage:

NR-55554 was packaged aseptically in cryovials. The product is provided frozen and should be stored at -60°C or colder immediately upon arrival. For long-term storage, the vapor phase of a liquid nitrogen freezer is recommended. Freeze-thaw cycles should be avoided.

#### Media:

Nutrient broth or Tryptic Soy broth or equivalent

Nutrient agar or Tryptic Soy agar or Tryptic Soy agar with 5% defibrinated sheep blood or equivalent

## Incubation:

Temperature: 37°C Atmosphere: Aerobic

#### Propagation:

- 1. Keep vial frozen until ready for use, then thaw.
- 2. Transfer the entire thawed aliquot into a single tube of broth.
- 3. Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate an agar slant and/or plate.
- 4. Incubate the tube, slant and/or plate at 37°C for 1 day.
