Mouse monoclonal antibody prepared against the envelope glycoprotein of dengue virus type 4 (DEN-4) was purified from clone E29 hybridoma supernatant by protein G affinity chromatography. The B cell hybridoma was generated by the fusion of P3X63Ag8.653 myeloma cells with immunized mouse splenocytes. The clone E29 antibody is reported to bind to domain III (DIII) in the envelope protein.¹

Material Provided:

Each vial of NR-15542 contains approximately 100 μ L of purified monoclonal antibody in PBS. The concentration, expressed as mg/mL, is shown on the Certificate of Analysis.

Packaging/Storage:

NR-15542 was packaged aseptically in screw-capped plastic vials and is provided frozen on dry ice. The product should be stored at -20°C or colder immediately upon arrival. Freeze-thaw cycles should be avoided.

Functional Activity:

NR-15542 is reactive on Vero cells infected with DEN-4, D85-019 in indirect immunofluorescence assays. The antibody is reported to be type-specific, neutralizing, and to react with DEN-4 DIII expressed on yeast cells.¹
