<u>Original Source</u>: *Klebsiella pneumoniae (K. pneumoniae*), strain MRSN 430405 was isolated in 2013 from a human blood sample in the Middle East as part of a global surveillance program.¹

Comments: K. pneumoniae, strain MRSN 430405 was deposited as part of the MRSN Klebsiella pneumoniae Diversity Panel available from BEI Resources as NR-55604. NR-55555 was deposited as multi-locus sequence type (MLST) ST 512, K-locus type (KL) 107, O-locus type (OL) O2v2 and VIR score 0. In addition, strain MRSN 430405 has a 51% truncation of the MgrB protein and a 25% truncation of the OmpK35 protein, which can cause a reduction in susceptibility to colistin and beta-lactamases, respectively, as well as a glycine-aspartic acid (GD) insertion in the B-strand loop of the OmpK36 protein (OmpK36GD). MRSN 430405 was deposited as an extensively drug-resistant strain, sensitive to ceftazidime/avibactam and tigecycline, intermediately resistant to gentamicin and tetracycline and resistant to amikacin, ampicillin/sulbactam, aztreonam, cefepime, ceftolozane/tazobactam, ceftazidime, ceftriaxone. ciprofloxacin, ertapenem, imipenem, piperacillin/tazobactam, meropenem, levofloxacin, tobramycin and trimethoprim/sulfamethoxazole. MRSN 430405 is reported to have three aminoglycoside transferase genes [aac(6')-lb-AKT, aadA2 and aph(3')-la; conferring resistance to various aminoglycosides], three beta-lactamase genes (blakpc-3, blashv-11 and blatem-1; conferring resistance to beta-lactams), one chloramphenicol acetyltransferase gene (catA1; conferring resistance to chloramphenicol), one macrolide phosphotransferase gene [mph(A); conferring resistance to macrolides], one sulfonamide resistance gene (sul1; conferring resistance to sulfonamides) and one dihydrofolate reductase gene (dfrA12; conferring resistance to trimethoprim).1 complete genome of K. pneumoniae, strain MRSN 430405 has been sequenced (GenBank: JAGYDE000000000).

K. pneumoniae is a Gram-negative enterobacterium that is a major cause of nosocomial infections of the urinary and

respiratory tracts. Due to the extensive spread of antibiotic-resistant strains, especially of extended-spectrum β -lactamase (ESBL)-producing strains, there has been renewed interest in *Klebsiella* infections. 2,3,4

Material Provided:

Each vial contains approximately 0.5 mL of bacterial culture in Tryptic Soy broth supplemented with 10% glycerol.

<u>Note</u>: If homogeneity is required for your intended use, please purify prior to initiating work.

Packaging/Storage:

NR-55555 was packaged aseptically in cryovials. The product is provided frozen and should be stored at -60°C or colder immediately upon arrival. For long-term storage, the vapor phase of a liquid nitrogen freezer is recommended. Freeze-thaw cycles should be avoided.

Growth Conditions:

Media

Nutrient broth or Tryptic Soy broth or equivalent

Nutrient agar or Tryptic Soy agar or Tryptic Soy agar with 5% defibrinated sheep blood or equivalent

Incubation:

Temperature: 37°C Atmosphere: Aerobic

Propagation:

- 1. Keep vial frozen until ready for use, then thaw.
- 2. Transfer the entire thawed aliquot into a single tube of broth.
- Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate an agar slant and/or plate.
- 4. Incubate the tube, slant and/or plate at 37°C for 1 day.
