

***Streptococcus pneumoniae*, Strain 1151222**

Product Description:

Streptococcus pneumoniae (*S. pneumoniae*), Strain 1151222 was isolated in 2014 from a sputum sample of a 10-year-old female child in Hong Kong. It was deposited as resistant to ampicillin, ceftriaxone, erythromycin, penicillin, tetracycline and trimethoprim/sulfamethoxazole. NR-56690 was produced by inoculation of the deposited material into Heart Brain Infusion broth and grown for 1 day at 37°C in an aerobic atmosphere with 5% CO₂. Broth inoculum was added to Tryptic Soy with 5% defibrinated sheep blood agar kolles, which were grown for 1 day at 37°C in an aerobic atmosphere with 5% CO₂ to produce this lot. Quality control testing was completed under propagation conditions unless otherwise noted.
