These bacteria are host generalists that occur in humans and many other mammals. Additionally, this serovar causes typhoid-like disease in mice and is used as a mouse model of human typhoid fever.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup>S. enterica subsp. enterica, 2004 Pennsylvania Tomato Outbreak, Serovar Typhimurium, Isolate 8 was isolated from the stool of a patient with diarrhea during the 2004 Salmonella outbreak in Pennsylvania (PA) and deposited by Carol H. Sandt, Molecular Microbiology Section, Bureau of Laboratories, PA Department of Health, Lionville, PA. The isolated material was grown on Tryptic Soy Agar plates which were used to inoculate Tryptic Soy Broth. The culture was cryogenically preserved in 20% glycerol at -70°C until deposition. NR-4340 was produced by inoculation of the deposited material into Tryptic Soy Broth (BD 211825) and grown 24 hours at 37°C and aerobic atmosphere. Broth inoculum was added to Kolles which were grown 24 hours at 37°C and aerobic atmosphere to produce this lot.
