Product Description: Mycobacterium tuberculosis (M. tuberculosis), strain 96-2265 was isolated between 1995 and 2000 from human sputum from an HIV-negative patient infected with pulmonary tuberculosis in North America. Strain 96-2265 was deposited as a multi-drug sensitive (MDS) strain of tuberculosis with sensitivity to rifampicin and isoniazid.

NR-30637 was produced by inoculation of the deposited material into Middlebrook 7H9 broth with ADC enrichment. Broth inoculum was added to Middlebrook 7H10 agar with OADC enrichment kolles, which were grown for 31 days at 37°C in an aerobic atmosphere with 5% CO₂ to produce this lot.

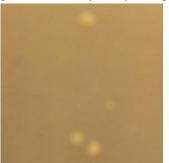
