¹NR-18991 was produced by inoculation of the deposited material into Middlebrook 7H9 broth with ADC enrichment. Broth inoculum was added to Middlebrook 7H10 agar with OADC enrichment kolles, which were grown for 44 days at 37°C in an aerobic atmosphere with 5% CO₂ to produce this lot.

⁶Purity of this lot was assessed for 115 days at 37°C in an aerobic atmosphere with 5% CO₂ on Middlebrook 7H10 agar with OADC enrichment and 24 days at 37°C in an aerobic atmosphere with 5% CO₂ on Tryptic Soy agar plates.
