Staphylococcus aureus subsp. aureus, Strain JE2, Transposon Mutant NE1957 (SAUSA300_0296)

Product Description: Staphylococcus aureus (S. aureus) subsp. aureus, transposon mutant NE1957 was derived from S. aureus subsp. aureus, strain JE2. Mutagenesis occurred through the use of the *mariner*-based transposon bursa aurealis resulting in an erythromycin-resistant deletion strain of JE2. S. aureus subsp. aureus, transposon mutant NE1957 was created by disruption of SAUSA300_0296, which encodes for a hypothetical protein. Strain JE2 is a plasmid-cured derivative of strain LAC that was isolated in 2002 from a skin and soft tissue infection of an inmate in the Los Angeles County Jail in California, USA.

¹NR-48499 was produced by inoculation of the deposited material into Tryptic Soy broth with 5 μg/mL erythromycin and incubated for 1 day at 37°C in an aerobic atmosphere. Broth inoculum was added to Tryptic Soy agar with 5 μg/mL erythromycin kolles which were grown 1 day at 37°C in an aerobic atmosphere to produce this lot.

⁴Purity of this lot was assessed for 7 days at 37°C in an aerobic atmosphere with 5% CO₂ on Tryptic Soy agar with 5% defibrinated sheep blood.





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 $^{^21}$ day at 37°C in an aerobic atmosphere on Tryptic Soy agar with 5 $\mu g/mL$ erythromycin

³Prior to initiating work, it is recommended that the presence and location of the transposon is confirmed. Gene specific primers should be paired with either the "Upstream" primer (5'-CTCGATTCTATTAACAAGGG-3') for transposons in the "plus" orientation or the "Buster" primer (5'-GCTTTTTCTAAATGTTTTTTAAGTAAATCAAGTAC-3') for transposons in the "minus" orientation.
